Please take time to sit down with your children, read the coloring book to them and help them with the educational activities.

- Make sure your child understands when it is and is not appropriate to call 9-1-1.
- Make sure they know their address and phone number, so if they ever have to call 9-1-1, they'll be able to give our call takers the information they need to send the appropriate emergency workers.


Learning about 9-1-1 will help your child feel less frightened in the event of an emergency. And most importantly, they'll know what to do if they need help.


I'm going to teach you how to use 9-1-1 in this coloring book so you can live a safe, happy life, too!



My friends and I like to play in the park. One day my friend Luke fell and hurt his leg. He couldn't get up. What should I do?




That's right! I went to the grown-up with us and told her we needed to call 9-1-1.




She took out her phone and asked me to dial. I told the 9-1-1 call taker my name, phone number and that we were in the park. They sent the ambulance right away!




There are many people who may come to help when you call 9-1-1. It may be the paramedic (EMT) in the ambulance, a firefighter or a police officer. They all keep us safe.




My friends and I like to have sleepovers. One of our favorite things to do at sleepovers is to watch movies and make popcorn.




Oh no! A fire started on the stove! What should we do?



That's right! We got out of the burning house and ran next door to a neighbor. Then we called 9-1-1.




The firefighters came to put out the fire and the police officers helped to take care of us.




So remember – in an emergency call 9-1-1 and the call taker will help save the day!





